Reg : Additions/Amendments in Examination Bye-Laws.

In pursuance to the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 13.5.2016 duly approved by the Governing Body in its Meeting held on 29th June, 2016, the following amendments/additions have been made in the Examination Bye-Laws:
